Zygomatic osteotomies doesn't move the orbitals only a lefort iii does that -that's why it is sometimes called a "true zygomatic osteotomy" becuase it actually mobilizes the whole zygomatic area. To be fair there are so many types of ZO's that I can't keep track of them all -what I know of the "sandwich" type is that it seals the osteomatic cut with HA-paste hence the nickname "sandwich". However from what I've heard this won't give us what we're after for a couple of reasons. First: the projection isn't enough, the effectivness of all osteotomies is limited by just how much bone that is actually moved and the ZO surgeries just doesn't involve enough skeletal tissue to make a big change in the overall structure. Second: the cut is done below the orbital to protect the important visual nerves that run through it look: ? We want augmentation around line A or even higher but the ZO cuts at B thus creating a lower more "round" cheekbone that looks great on women but bad on men. If you need orbital augmentation like me ZO won't help at all, and considering what I just wrote I am sceptical it is a good option for augmenting zygos at all actually. There's more to learn though. Implants is the other option to really augment the orbitals but the results will never look as good/natural as actually moving the bone forward (not saying it will be bad necessarily) and it comes with all the usual risks of foreign implants: bone loss, movement, infection, bad aesthetic result due to aging etc etc. I mean if the risks with a lefort iii aren't much worse in the hand of a skilled surgeon then why would anyone go with implants?
