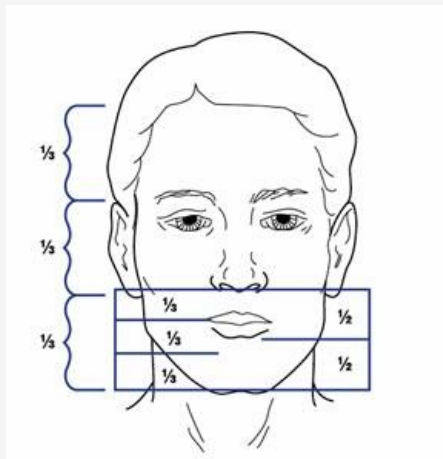

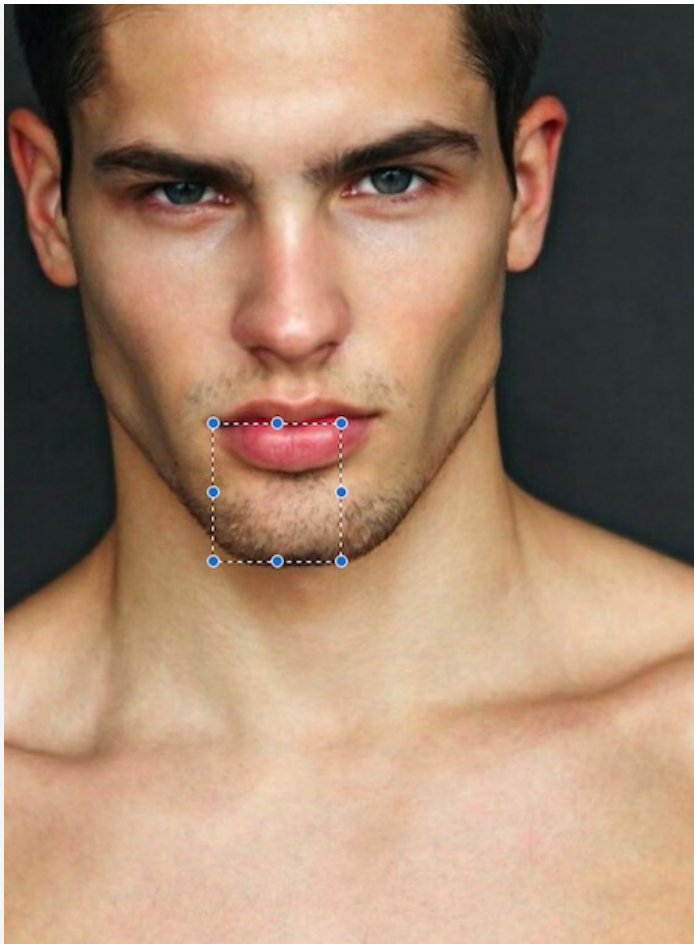

Divide your lower face into 2 parts - one from bottom of the chin to stomion and stomion to subnasale. Measure the length of each part and divide.

This is only legit for people who have too short or too long chin, then this is ratio legit for helping them to identify that. A lot of people will have normal length, but they won't look good. I have seen some obviously too short chins, but I haven't seen too long, although I'm pretty sure they exists.
